Approval of Agenda: It was moved, by Herb Erickson and seconded by Jim Decker to approve the agenda with additions. **Approved**

Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting: Ken Reding moved, and Larry Scilley seconded to approve the minutes from the May 10, 2022, Board Meeting. **Approved**
