Christmas Anonymous 2021:

The 56th year of Christmas Anonymous is in the history books and it was a different year. Many changes occurred from the past and even leading up to what was envisioned.

COVID-19 again became a player and plans became fluid as the weeks approached. Some departments were eliminated, such as used toys, coats, and boots because of the pandemic and applicants filled out lists which were assembled for distribution on store day. The schools were not asked for donations, although a few did do a drive which our club and the Golden K did pick up. KTTC did do their normal toy drive which was successful, and our clubs helped unload the truck.

The food was packed at Channel One again this year and brought over and distributed on store day, this was done for the applicants and 320 senior boxes which were delivered. Our club and the Golden-K hauled over 35 bikes (down from approximately 220 in past years because of the loss of the repair facility). All toys, clothing, and teen items were moved from storage to CUMC and excess returned; and the weather cooperated greatly (except for store day).

In all, 445 families including 1,331 children ages 1 to 18 were treated to a Merrier Christmas. Numbers were down for several reasons chiefly the pandemic and the storm on store day. Our participation was down, partly due to some miscommunication about help we were expecting. But we did manage to complete our part.

As a side note, JM raised over \$33,000 for Christmas Anonymous.
