MEETING: December 12, 2023

The Board meeting was called to order at 10:10 AM by President Janet Cederholm.

<u>Approval of Agenda:</u> It was moved by Jim Decker and seconded by Dave Bhaskaran to approve the agenda as corrected. **Motion Passed**

Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting:

Jim Decker made the motion to approve the minutes, of the meeting of November 14, 2023. Ruth Vrieze seconded the motion. **Minutes were Approved.** Larry Scilley moved, and David Bhaskaran seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the special board meeting of November 28, 2023. **Minutes were approved**.

Becky Hopson moved, and it was seconded by Ruth Vrieze to approve the monthly report to Kiwanis International for November 2023 **Approved**Treasurer's Report as of November 30, 2023: The printed report was sent out to all board members in the packets before the meeting. Ruth stated that she had distributed the Christmas cards from the Day Makers to various locations where the homeless congregate and to care centers. Jim Schwinghammer said there was nothing new to report other than that the meeting times will be changed for the Operations and Fund Raising committee.

Christmas Anonymous Recap:

Christmas Anonymous for 2023 is past and successful. Our Day Makers participation was good and I thank all who helped. While the tasks have reduced from past years, it still requires a lot of effort. While we no longer must load and unload bikes, fruit and food, we still visit participating schools for their donations, unload the KTTC toy drive truck, load and unload tables, move items from storage to CUMC and back, cut up cardboard and help get CUMC cleaned up. We used to accomplish this with just our club and the Golden K, but this is becoming a bigger job than our two clubs can handle alone now and we received much appreciated help from the Sheriff's Sentenced to Serve, the Grizzlies hockey team and a number of volunteers including senior softball players.



The number of participants this year was 442 families which included 594 boys and 708 girls which ranged in age from 1 to 18. While 560 families had originally registered there was a 22% no-show, which is probably due to movement of the families between registration and store day. Jack will tally the hours we volunteered, and it is significant. Once again I thank I thank you all.
