Approval of Agenda: It was moved by Jim Decker and seconded by Garry Post to approve the agenda with one correction. **Approved**

<u>Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting:</u> Ken Reding moved, and Larry Scilley seconded to approve the minutes from the March 14, 2023, Board Meeting. **Motion was Approved**

<u>Treasurer's Report as of March 31, 2023:</u> The printed report was sent out to all board members preceding the meeting. Dave Bhaskaran moved, and Helen Kolb seconded the motion to accept the report. **Motion was Approved.**

OLD BUSINESS:

Reminder of the upcoming Kiwanis International Convention in Minneapolis June 22nd through 24th was made. Linda mentioned that she would be attending. It was mentioned that it could be watched virtually. It was, also, announced that the MNDAK District Convention will be held in St. Cloud, MN August 4th through 6th 2023.

Comment was made by Jack that if you could only attend one Convention it should be the District Convention. Delegates to the International Convention will be named at the May Board Meeting.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Jim Decker announced that the second quarter audit of the Administrative and Service accounts for the 2022-2023 Kiwanis year (January – March) will be done by himself, Dave Bhaskaran and Jack Zierdt on Tuesday April 18th following our regular meeting.

A discussion was held regarding Rochester Service Clubs Collaboration. Some of the comments were that a collective venture is being considered. An exchange of ideas of how we make Rochester better by our services. Linda and Jack stated that we need more information and better directives as to what this Collaboration is trying to accomplish. We are not ready to get involved in this process as a Kiwanis Club at this time.

NEW BUSINESS:

Jack Zierdt stated that he had the applications for the 2 scholarships that we award to Century High School Key Club Seniors. Kathy Davis will get these to the Key Club so that the applications can be completed and returned to our club no later than May 1st. These two scholarships will be \$1,000.00 each. **Board Approved** Linda read a letter of a \$1,000.00 scholarship award to a Century High School Student from the Minnesota-Dakotas Kiwanis District Educational Foundation. Helen asked why \$1,000 instead of the \$700 advertise grant. Jack stated that he took the liberty of adding the \$300 to the grant amount that other clubs are asked to add. He stated that we have funds in our Charitable Account for this scholarship addition and the total board agreed with this logic.

Initial discussion was held regarding the Kiwanis International Dues Increase that will be voted on at the Kiwanis International Convention in Minneapolis. More discussion and information will be discussed with our club membership before the May 9th Board Meeting. At the Board Meeting on the 9th of May the direction of our vote on the dues increase will be given to our delegates. A \$30 increase per year is being asked currently. That is an increase of \$7.50 per quarter.

Larry Scilley and Jim Schwinghammer will present to the membership on April 18th a request of needed help for items needed by Catholic Charities for refugee's resettlement. Linda moved and Dave moved that will hold a club shower of items, cash and/or gift cards at our April 25th meeting. Motion Approved Following Discussion, the Board agreed to hold a regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday May 30th (the day after Memorial Day Monday)

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>Community Service:</u> Rick stated that we will have a Litter Bit Better service activity following our meeting on April 25th.

Early Childhood Committee: Linda reported that the SMIF Books will be taken to Mighty Oaks, Hoover Pre-school, and Pinewood Elementary in May. More information on dates that we will be doing this will be forthcoming and help will be needed.

Membership Committee and Operations/Fund

Raising: Jim stated that a joint Membership discussion with Sunrisers Kiwanis with Linda, Janet, and himself present. One of the items discussed was a Kiwanis attendance at a Honkers Baseball Game as a potential fundraiser.
