Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting: Herb Erickson moved, and Jim Decker seconded to approve the minutes from the July 11, 2023, Board Meeting as printed. Motion was Approved.

Back-to-School Supplies, and backpacks will be delivered to Riverside, Pinewood and Harriet Bishop following our meeting on Tuesday August 22nd. A Special Board meeting was called to order following the regular membership meeting for the following purpose: President Linda received a request from Riverside to help provide snacks for the students for the first few weeks of school until the subsidized snacks start coming. They would need 400 servings a day for 14 days, bulk items rather than single serve. Snacks for one day at Riverside (for 500 kids) would be about \$100/day for such things as honey nut cheerios, animal crackers or cheezits. The same snacks for the 150 at Bishop would be about \$30. These are bulk items, not individually packaged.

Following comments by Linda and others regarding the request and total cost for the snacks, as well as comments regarding the budget and Day Makers funds available, it was also mentioned that we pass a container around for our members that might want to donate to the cause, at our next meeting, a motion was made by Helen Kolb and seconded by Jim Decker.
