The meeting was called to order at 10:20 AM.

<u>Approval of Agenda:</u> Jim Decker made the motion to approve the agenda, and Ruth Vrieze seconded the motion. Agenda was approved.

Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting: Janet Cederholm made the motion to approve the minutes, of the meeting of September 16, 2025. Jim Decker seconded the motion. Minutes were Approved.

A motion was made by Dave Bhaskaran and seconded by Helen Kolb to approve the September 2025 monthly report to Kiwanis International. **Motion was approved.**

The sheet of comparison of monthly service hours was presented as part of the secretary's report.

<u>Treasurer's Report as of September 30, 2025:</u> The report was sent out to all board members in the packets before the meeting. Ruth Vrieze moved to accept the report as presented and Becky Hopson seconded the motion. **Motion was Approved.**

Jack stated that the annual rose sale was a successful fund raiser. The final financial report will be presented once we have received the final bill from the Spring Valley Kiwanis Club.

It was recommended that a list of rationale be listed for future nominees to go along with the Kiwanis International guidelines for Honorary Member Classification.

The Winter Wishes 2025 JP Family Seasonal Gift Program was presented to the board in their packet. Following discussion of the request from the Jeremiah Program it was decided, by consensus, that we would inform the membership that the board would match donations to total \$425 to support one family (1 mother and 2 children) for this event.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Tom Grogan reported that Meals on Wheels is delivering between 9 and 11 meals per week. He stated we can always use more help. He reported that Channel One volunteering is still on hold as needs more help. Watch for sign-up sheet to help with the Bear Creek Trail cleanup. The library packing and delivery to the birthing centers is doing 350 packets per month. we do not have enough individuals to meet their minimum workers per shift.

Bear Creek Trail cleanup Delivery needs more help and requires some moderate lifting to move the supplies from the library to the birthing centers. Tom stated that information on Christmas Anonymous would be coming out soon. Rick stated that he would be getting out some scheduling signup sheets for help soon. Dave Bhaskaran in his Early Childhood Development Committee report stated that the Pinewood reading helps program is up and running but they are facing some struggles with the school scheduling space for the room assignments for this help. There was a question on the Pen Pal Program and where we are with it as a club? Do we have a school? Do we have volunteers in the club to do this project?

Ruth Vrieze Human and Spiritual Aims Committee chairperson reported that she had sent Thinking of you cards to Becky Cook on September 17th following her fall and surgery for a broken arm; and to Shar Hain with health concerns and not able to attend meetings. On October 7th she sent a card that all members present at the meeting signed, to Larry Scilley upon his resignation from the club. A sympathy card was sent to Tim Alexander and the family of Dave Alexander on his passing on October 11th. On October 21st she had a Thinking of You card at the meeting for Shar Hain, for all members present at the meeting to sign. This was for all that she has done over the years for the club, upon her resignation.

Kathy Davis was absent from the meeting, but Jack reported that he and Kathy will be doing an Orientation for Joe Hopson on Thursday October 23rd. Joe will be joining our Day Makers on Tuesday October 28th. We continue to need new members was stated during the Membership Committee Report.

Jim Schwinghammer said he is still exploring ways to raise funds in his Operations and Fund-Raising Committee Report.

Greg Hain stated that he is working on updating the Web site. He will be checking with MLT Group now that we don't have the hockey festival on what we can do to update our Web site during his Public Relations Committee report. The PR Committee meet on the 4th Tuesdays of the month, following our regular weekly meeting, starting on October 28th.

Jack and Janet mentioned that National Key Club week is coming up. It was suggested they arrange to take treats to the meeting to celebrate and recognize National Key Club week November 3rd through the 7th.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:40 AM.
